ISRAEL: OBJECTION TO THE RESERVATION CONTAINED IN THE COMMUNICATION BY THE
PLURINATIONAL STATE OF BOLIVIA¹

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary,
communicates the following:

The above action was effected on 8 January 2013.

“The Permanent Mission of Israel to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honor to refer to the Secretary-General’s Depositary Notification (C.N.829.2011.TREATIES-28) of January 10, 2012, which contained the proposed reservation to the Single Convention on Narcotic Drugs, 1961, as amended (the Convention), submitted by the Plurinational State of Bolivia in accordance with Article 50, paragraph 3 of the Convention.

Israel objects to the proposed reservation. There is a substantial danger that the reservation might lead to a greater supply of available coca and an increase of coca production and sales. As a result, the reservation might weaken the international efforts to prevent illicit production, traffic and abuse of drugs which constitute the cornerstone of the Convention.”
